

6. VRC:

6.1 Awards:

At the beginning of 1990, the VRC changed emphasis of awards from competitor gradings to capacity classes. Hence, VRC events and the overall championship will give the following awards:

- Outright
- Novice
- PRC - Up to 1300cc 2WD
- PRC - 1301cc to 1600cc 2WD
- PRC - 1601cc to 2000cc 2WD
- PRC - Over 2000cc 2WD
- PRC - 4WD
- Group N - Up to 1600cc 2WD
- Group N - 1601cc and Over 2WD
- Group N - 4WD
- Formula Commodore

6.2 Bitumen Stage:

"At its meeting on 31st July, 1993, the National Rally Committee resolved that for any C5 or C10 ARC event which wishes to utilise bitumen special stages at greater than 2km in length, a proposal on the subject be sent to the Secretary of the National Rally Committee, which will be discussed with the Event Checker and the National Rally Committee member from the State in which the event is being held, prior to approval or otherwise being granted for the bitumen stage."

6.3 Official's Prize Pool:

Each special stage event is required to levy each crew \$20 (reduced from \$25 on 12/1/93 to offset DC&NR surety levy. Please refer to the Road Damage section for details.) being for the creation of a cash prize pool to be awarded to the officials of that event. The determination of the number of cash prizes and which type of officials is to receive them is to be made by the VRC co-ordinator and event directors at the beginning of each year.

At its January, 1993 meeting the Rally Panel resolved to allow VRC directors to replace the levy with the equivalent total pool value of goods and/or services to be distributed to all their event's officials. Permission must be sought from the VRC co-ordinator and the equivalence of value must be demonstrated to him/her before directors can utilise this option.

6.4 Point Score System:

VRC points score system for each category is:

- Outright - 20,15,12,10,8,6,4,3,2,1
- All other classes and categories - 9,6,4,3,2,1

6.5 *Series Registration:*

At the September, 1993 Rally Panel meeting the following resolution defining the VRC Series Registration requirements was carried (9309/27):

"That the Victorian Rally Championship competitor registration be based on the following commencing from 1st January, 1994.

1. It is in the best interests of the VRC that point scores and prize money be awarded to bona-fide VRC competitors only, to avoid distortion of relevant point scores during the year by ARC competitors.
2. In view of the need to raise a levy for the road damage surety and in order to reduce competitors costs, the registration for competitors holding Victorian CAMS licences or deemed to be Victorian competitors by the Victorian Rally Panel be free.
3. Competitors holding other than Victorian CAMS Licences or who are not Victorian competitors as deemed by the Victorian Rally Panel, wishing to compete for VRC points and prize money be permitted to do so on payment of a \$20 registration fee per event. This registration fee should be shown as an option on the entry form.
4. Both driver and co-driver must complete one of the following 3 declarations:
 - a) "I hold a Victorian CAMS Licence/I am deemed to be a Victorian competitor by the Victorian Rally Panel and I am therefore registering for VRC points and awards for this event." , or
 - b) "I hold a CAMS Licence from a State other than Victoria/I have been deemed not to be a Victorian competitor by the Victorian Rally Panel and wish to register for VRC points and awards for this event. I enclose the fee of \$20 per competitor for this event in addition to the entry fee." , or
 - c) I do not wish to register for VRC points and awards."

These declarations and licences must be checked at documentation scrutiny (normally combined with vehicle scrutiny) and the event and series results compiled accordingly."

6.6 *Service Crew Instructions:*

To aid competitor planning, organisers of VRC events and the VRC component of dual status events are recommended to issue the service crew instructions for their event at the same time as the final instructions/further regulations.
